Ensuring Gloucester Nursery stays COVID-19 secure over the year Please read all the information given to you about protecting everyone at Gloucester Nursery from COVID-19

- Do not attend the nursery if you or your child is unwell
- Clean hands thoroughly more often than usual
- Ensure good respiratory hygiene by promoting 'catch it, bin it, kill it'
- Minimise contact between each other remember social distancing with other staff, other children and parents
- Please can parents avoid touching surfaces and equipment within the nursery
- Can all parents please wear masks when dropping off and picking up their children
- Sanitise lunchboxes each day at home
- Toys and books from home cannot enter the nursery
- Contact the nursery immediately in the event that a test proves positive
- In the event of infection engage with the NHS Test and Trace process.

Safeguarding Information: If you are worried about a child's welfare please speak to our Designated Safeguarding Leads; either myself or Kerry, our Senior Family Worker. Please see a member of the office staff if you need information or leaflets. All nursery staff have attended safeguarding training and do receive regular updates. Contact numbers are displayed on the information board and leaflets are available from the reception area.

On-Line Safety: Please find attached information and an agreement regarding our on-line safety rules. We request that parents/carers read the agreement carefully. This will confirm that rules and procedures have been understood.

Children's Learning G2

This term is all about the children getting to know each other, the children getting to know the staff and generally settling into the nursery. The children's learning often takes them outdoors where they develop, among other things, gross motor skills. Please do bring in appropriate clothing so your child can be completely involved in all the rich and valuable experiences. **Please look at the Parent Board daily for any information, this is where notices are usually placed.**

G2- Things to do at home with your child to support their learning

- Let your child help with unpacking the shopping by telling them to find different things like, "find the apples," or "find the crackers."
- Increase your child's independence by letting them wash their face or try and put welly boots on by themselves.
- Play games where your child listens to instructions such as "roll the ball, kick the ball and throw the ball."
- Read story books to your child, making the sounds of the animals or sounds of the objects.
- Encourage your child to have a go at drinking from an open cup.

Children's Learning G3

Children in the main nursery (G3)

Your child is continuing on their learning journey through the Early Years Foundation Stage and will continue to build on the skills and knowledge they have acquired so far. Sometimes, children seem to 'forget' something they have learned but please be assured, that knowledge is still in there, it is just perhaps on hold for a while to enable them to learn something new.

The children will be supported to get to know each other and the staff in the nursery this term while learning self-help skills and independence to enable them to access all areas of the learning environment. The children will be encouraged to try new activities and help each other once a skill is mastered. They will self-access all areas of the nursery. Snacks are supervised by a member of staff.

Please support your child by letting them carry their own bag and hang it on their peg, and put their lunch box on the trolley if they have a packed lunch. At home, please encourage your child to do age appropriate tasks for themselves. This could include putting shoes on, getting something out of the cupboard or fridge to help and helping select items when shopping.

Parents/carers involved in children's learning and development through using an IT software package called Tapestry

Tapestry enables the nursery-home dialogue with families, giving staff opportunity to share your child's learning and experiences with you, while providing you with a platform to share significant moments from home with your child's family worker. Please feel free to log into your account and see how your child's learning and development is progressing while they attend Gloucester Nursery. Tapestry is a safe space and the images and data within it are protected by safeguarding features. Gloucester Nursery School's use of Tapestry is in full-compliance with the GDPR. **'GOALS': Gloucester Observation And Learning Summary** - At the end of every week, a summary of the learning that has taken place at nursery as well as ways you can support your child's learning will be sent to you.

Records will be kept about your child's development and these will be shared with you. Telephone consultations or informal meetings with social distancing will be arranged to discuss your child's progress and next steps.

3 and 4 year olds only:

Parents and Children - Things to do

Personal and Social

Encourage your child to be more independent. E.g. Finding their own peg and hanging their coat on it.

Play games together encouraging your child to take turns and to listen and respond to what is being said to them.

Mathematics

Support your child to count steps, stairs, cars, buses, biscuits – any opportunity for counting.

Ask your child "How many?"

Play, Learn Grow...

Read together!

Get Talking

Understanding others and knowing what to say are really important skills. They help children to make friends, learn and enjoy life to the full. Children need more time than adults to think about what they have heard and to decide what to say back so...

Top Tips!

- Give your child time to respond and look at them while you wait.
- Get your child's attention by saying their name before you start speaking.
- Give your child plenty of time to think.
- Talk together about the seasons, trees, and seasonal weather changes.
- Go on an adventure and talk about your discoveries e.g. What can you find in the park?

Help your child to fill in the missing word, phrase or join in with known rhymes and stories. Show your child how to handle books carefully and to know what the different parts of a book are e.g. pages. Let your child see you reading. Talk about and retell favourite stories.

Look for print out and about.

Safeguarding children is everyone's responsibility. Please can parents:

- 1. <u>Close all external gates. If you</u> <u>see a parent leave the gate</u> <u>open please speak to them!!!!!!</u>
- 2. Can parents please wear a mask at all times.
- 3. Only use mobile phones when you have left the school site
- 4. Leave pushchairs outside in order to help with congestion.

Attendance: It is important for your child to have regular attendance at the nursery. Failure to do so often results in children having difficulties in settling into routines, gaining friends and the progress and achievement they make. Although the children's attendance is not statutory, the Governors, Local Authority and Ofsted do request information on attendance figures. Please can I remind you to phone if your child is ill and unable to attend the session. In the case of sickness and diarrhoea the nursery policy is keeping the child at home for **48 hours**. Please phone each day.

Collecting children – Please notify us if someone else is collecting your child. Children under the age of 16 are not allowed to collect children. At pick up times, please wait in the area where you dropped off your child. A member of staff will hand over your child to you.

Please be punctual – children can become worried and upset if parents are late.

Governors

Gloucester Nursery School is supported by a dedicated Governing Body that meet once a term. Progress and development work within the nursery is achieved by a shared vision of aiming for excellence and by governors challenging Gloucester to constantly improve standards through their role as 'critical friend.' The Governing Body meet in the evening to discuss matters such as health and safety; staffing; premises and finance. We have a delegated budget and this means additional responsibilities for the Governing Body.
