## Intimate Care and Toileting Policy and Procedures

#### **Policy Statement**

- No child is excluded from participating in our setting who may, for any reason, not yet be toilet trained and who may still be wearing nappies or equivalent. We work with parents/carers towards toilet training, unless there are medical or other developmental reasons why this may not be appropriate at the time.
- We provide nappy changing facilities and exercise good hygiene practices in order to accommodate children who are not yet toilet trained. Parents/carers are asked to provide their own nappies, wipes and nappy bags.
- We see toilet training as a self-care skill that children have the opportunity to learn with the full support and non-judgemental concern of adults.

### Safeguarding

- All staff are DBS checked in accordance with the safer recruitment and child protection policies.
- If staff have any concerns, such as noticing bruising or marks, when changing a child, they will follow normal reporting procedures.

#### Procedures

- Family Workers are aware if the children in their care are in nappies or 'pull-ups' and those children who have occasional accidents.
- Children should wear 'pull-ups' or other types of training pants as soon as they are comfortable with this and their parents/carers agree.
- There are changing stations in both our two year old provision (G2) and in the Nurture Nest area which may be used to lay young children down on. The stations are at adult working height. Our changing areas are warm, with no bright lights shining down into children's eyes. Each child's bag is collected before changing nappies so that their nappies, pull-ups and changing wipes are close to hand.
- Any member of staff changing a child will inform their colleagues and doors are left open to allow communication between staff.

- Our staff put on gloves before changing starts and the areas are prepared. New gloves are used each time a new child is changed.
- All our staff are familiar with good hygiene procedures and carry these out when changing nappies.
- Our staff never turn their back on a child or leave them unattended whilst they are on the changing station.
- We are gentle when changing; we avoid pulling faces and making negative comments about 'nappy contents'.
- In addition, we ensure that nappy changing is relaxed and a time to promote independence in young children.
- We encourage children to take an interest in using the toilet, and will support them in learning the routines.
- We encourage children to wash their hands, and have soap and towels to hand.
- Children access the toilet when they have the need to and are encouraged to be independent.
- Soiled or wet nappies or 'pull-ups' are put in a nappy bag and then placed in an appropriate nappy disposal bin. Bins located away from the main nursery environment.

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
