Children with Special Educational Needs

Gloucester Nursery School currently has 11 children with special educational needs. 3 children have Education, Health and Care Plans. The majority of children with special educational needs have communication and language difficulties. All children irrespective of their level of need are making substantive progress. The school provides a range of support for children with special educational needs including specialised language groups, small group work as well as partnership working with outside agencies and parents

Accessibility

Gloucester Nursery School is a fully inclusive school and continuously strives to make adaptations to its environment to ensure all children from the local community can come and flourish within the school. We were once again awarded the Inclusion Quality Mark Inclusion Award in June 2016.

Attendance

The school is actively working to support families to attend regularly and punctually. For the past 2 terms, children who have 100% attendance have had their names printed in our termly newsletter. In order for children to learn and reach their full potential they need to attend school on a regular basis. Hopefully we can all work together to improve our attendance rates.

The Nursery Budget April 2015- March 2016:

The nursery has an income budget - we estimated receiving £386,735 (funding from the County Council, income from additional sessions and other income received during the year and including the carry forward from 14/15)

We received more income than estimated – an additional £181,915 over the course of the year, total £568,650 and spent £487,489 on salaries, premises costs, supplies and services, setting up the new G2 provision-giving us a balance of £81,161 to carry forward to 2016/17
