The vast majority of children in receipt of EYPP are working in either 22 – 36 months or 30 – 50 months developmental bands across most areas of learning. In the strands Self Confidence and Self-Esteem, Technology and Being Imaginative 100% of children in receipt of EYPP are working in 30 – 50 months band.
