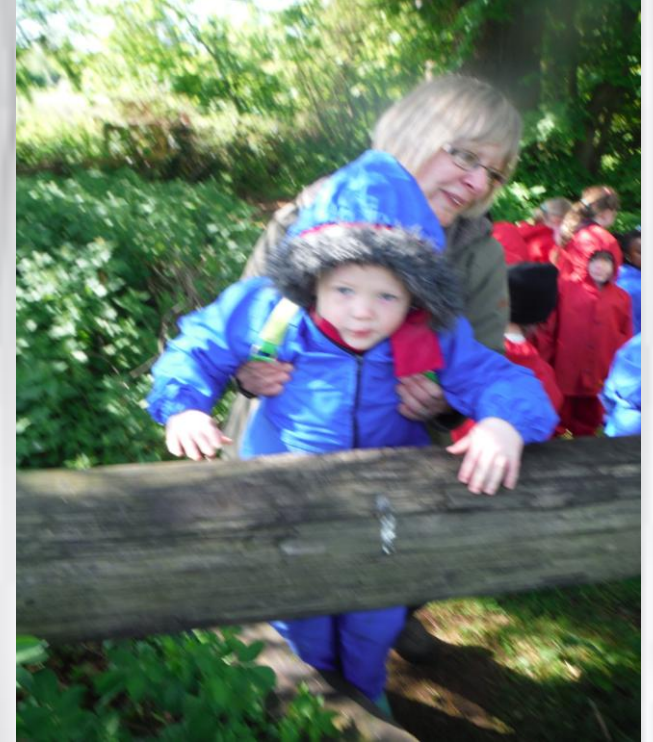
Climbing the stile

This is tricky. You have to hug the log to stop you from tumbling down!



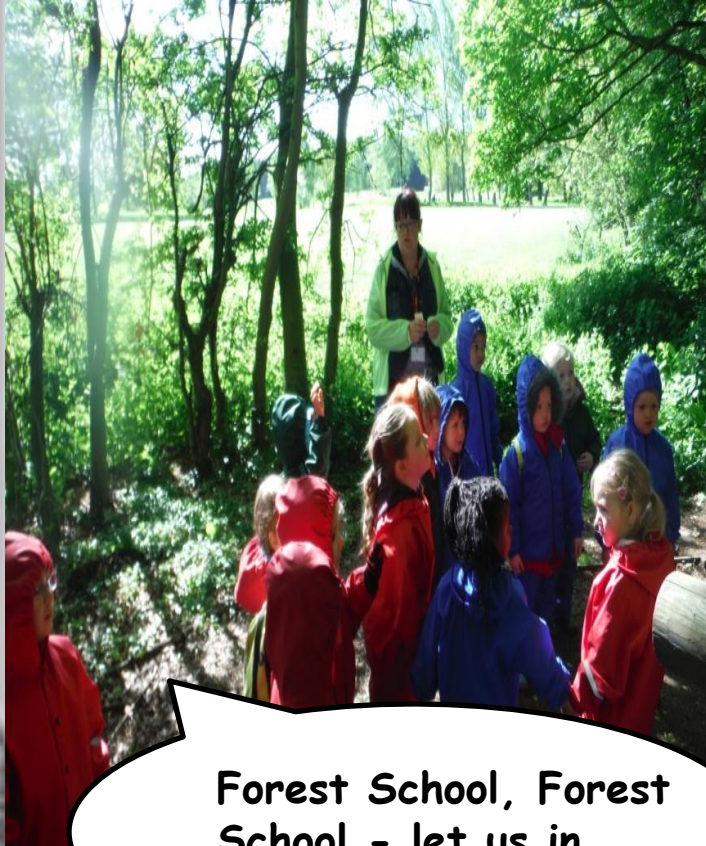
Over we go!

The moles had been very busy and had left mounds all over the place. Harry told us that...

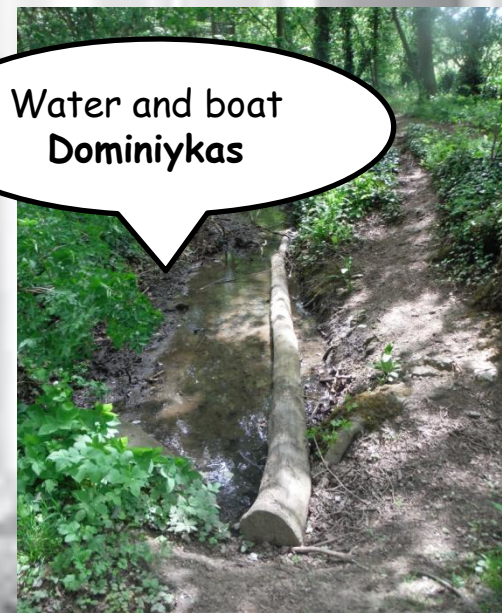


(These are) Mole mountains. I've seen a mole on my telly.

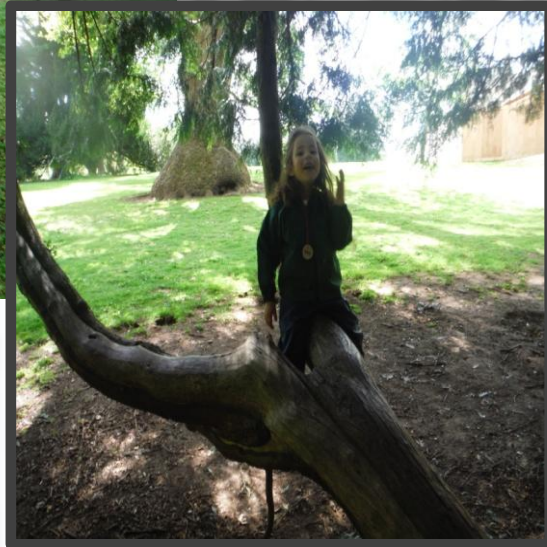
