We played 1,2,3...where are you? This game is like hide and seek and we were much better at listening and calling to one another this week.




Rebecca, please can I do the counting? Amelia

I like climbing...tree and rocks. **Gabriela** 




This free was amazing to climb and everybody wanted to fit inside it. At times, it was a tight squeeze and we had to think very carefully about where we were putting our feet.
