



This is one of our favourite stories and it is even more exciting when you have a real forest to explore as you retell the story.


A deep, dark cave...

Rhys was interested in the sheets that Julia got out from her bag and asked...




Dens

We found lots signs that there were many different woodland creatures.




We left food for the magpies as we left Forest School today.
